WHEREAS, in accordance with Ordinance No. 54 of Session 2008, the Council of the City of York, Pennsylvania, (Council) has the authority to adopt by Resolution permit fees to be imposed in accordance with Article 1501 of the Codified Ordinances for the City of York, Pennsylvania ("City"), and

WHEREAS, City council is empowered to approve such fees for Fire Code Permits, such fees having been provided to City Council not less than one (1) meeting prior hereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of York, Pennsylvania, the City Council hereby approves the following list of fees to become **effective January 1, 2010**, as set forth herein:

Any occupancy that requires two (2) or more operational permits shall be charged the highest permit fee plus \$10 per each additional required operational permit.

CONSTRUCTION PERMITS

The fee for construction permits required under Sections 105.7.1 through Section 105.7.13 shall be one percent (1%) of the valuation of the work plus \$25.

Permit fees shall include one (1) inspection and one (1) re-inspection. All subsequent re-inspections shall be billed at the rate of \$75 per hour, one (1) minimum to be billed in ¼ hour increments thereafter.

Alarm Systems, up to 49 Devices	\$150
Alarm System, 50 to 100 Devices	\$250
Alarm Systems, over 100 Devices	\$350
Commercial Cooking Fire Suppression Systems	\$100
All Other Plan Reviews	\$75 per hour, 1 hour minimum billed in ¼ hour increments thereafter
